TELEHEALTH SERVICES FOR ADULTS WITH ADHD

Teleheath (medical consultation via phone or video) has been subsidised by the Australian Government through the Medical Benefits Scheme (MBS) since 2002, but was restricted to patients in eligible areas, patients of Aboriginal Community Controlled Health Organisations and patients in residential aged care.

Teleheath subsidies were temporarily expanded during the COVID-19 pandemic to include more types patients and patient needs and most of these changes were made permanent on 1 January 2022. The Australian Government is currently **reviewing telehealth services** to check that the quality of care being provided matches that provided by face-to-face services.

The review committee released its draft report in September 2023 which is now available for comment and feedback. The report makes 10 recommendations, which you can read **here**, however, recomendation 9 relates directly to the experiences of adults with ADHD seeking services (especially diagnosis) from psychiatrists:


Recommendation 9: for initial consultations, non-GP specialist MBS items should be made available only face-to-face, with subsequent consultations available through telephone or video at the clinician's discretion.

This means that adults seeking an ADHD diagnosis <u>from a psychiatrist they had not previously worked with</u> would have to attend a face-to-face appointment.

Some members of this community have had excellent experiences of telehealth with psychiatrists and other clinicians. Others have found telehealth disappointing and ineffective.
