A PUSH TO INCREASE THE ROLE OF GENERAL PRACTITIONERS IN THE DIAGNOSIS AND MANAGEMENT OF ADHD IN ADULTS

The Royal Australian College of General Practitioners says GPs could play a larger role in ADHD diagnosis and treatment to improve affordability and access to care for patients, particularly adult patients who do not have access to diagnosis via a paediatrician.

In a submission to the <u>Senate inquiry into assessment and support services for people with ADHD</u> the college noted that most public sector mental health services do not provide ADHD services, resulting in an over-reliance on private sector care and services. Long wait times and high costs are typical, with one college member reporting that it would cost their patient over \$700 for a telehealth ADHD diagnosis from a specialist, although costs of around \$3,000 have been reported in the media.

Each Australian state operates under different rules for diagnosis and prescription of stimulant medication. For children up to 18 years of age, GPs in Qld and NSW can diagnose ADHD and initiate stimulant medication prescriptions but other states and territories require specialist diagnosis and prescribing. GPs cannot diagnose or initiate stimulant medication for ADHD in adults in any state or territory.

The college president said that "access to AHD diagnosis is inadequate and unaffordable for too many patients. People with ADHD need lifelong and individualised support...more than two thirds of people with ADHD have at least one other condition such as ASD, depression, anxiety and sleep disorders. Commonwealth governments should coordinate funding for models of care which support shared care models and clear health pathways for patients."

EMOTION DYSREGULATION IN ADULTS WITH ADHD

A Spanish research group has explored the repercussions of ADHD on the social, academic and professional lives of adults with ADHD.
